Aim: Using evidence to draw conclusions

Using the information that you have found out about what different types of dinosaurs eat. Imagine that you are opening up a dino cafe where you are creating a menu that would appeal to different types of dinosaurs.

Think about the types of foods that the different dinosaurs would have liked.

History

Aim: Be able to gather information from simple sources

Choose one of the main historical periods from the time of the dinosaurs and make a powerpoint presentation all about it. Include facts about the types of animals and what the world's landscapes and climate was like. Choose from: Jurassic, Triassic or Cretaceous.

Complete three academic and two personal learning activities

Personal Learning

Cooperation:

Work with your parents to create and write down or follow a recipe to make dinosaur cookies. Don't forget to bring one in for your teacher to try!

Enquiry:

How did the dinosaurs really die out? There have been lots of theories and ideas. Research as many different ones you can find and explain which one you agree with most and why!

Communication:

Make up a dinosaur song or rap to help you remember as many of the facts that you have learnt throughout the topic as possible.

Geography

Aim: Be able to make simple map.

Using your knowledge you have learnt about dinosaurs throughout the topic, design the map of a dinosaur-themed park. Think about:

- Themes of your rides
- Pathways
- Facilities your customers would need e.g. toilets, cafes etc
- Could your park have exhibits and educational areas?

Art

Aim: to suggest improvements for everyday use

Make a collage picture of a typical dinosaur scene including the use of a landscape and some different dinosaurs.

Think about what type of materials you might use to create different effects and the colours.
